

## CET Admissions Policy and Procedures

CET seeks academically strong applicants who are enthusiastic about cultural immersion. Ideal applicants demonstrate seriousness in both academics (a GPA of 3.0 or higher is required) and purpose. Applications should reflect the student's willingness and ability to embrace the challenges of living abroad and give back to the host community.

CET uses a rolling admissions process. Students are encouraged to apply early to secure a spot on the program of their choice. (CET Film Production is the one CET program that does not use rolling admissions because reviewing applicants as a cohort allows CET to assemble a group of students that can best complement each other's skills.) Application deadlines are posted on the CET website.

Students apply via the CET on-line application system and are required to submit several materials including, but not limited to:

1. Academic record: official transcript(s) and GPA
2. Letters of recommendation
3. Statement of purpose
4. Essay in target language, when applicable
5. Proof of language ability such as transcripts, letter from evaluator, etc., when applicable
6. Portfolio, when applicable

CET evaluates each application holistically. No single component of an application is sufficient for admission nor is its lack sufficient for rejection, so long as applicants are able to demonstrate that they can compensate in other ways.

CET is committed to providing equal opportunity to study abroad and does not discriminate on the basis of race, religion, color, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, age, disability, marital status, national and ethnic origin or other status or condition that is protected by applicable law.

CET typically appraises students of admissions decisions within two weeks of receipt of the completed application (or within three weeks of the application deadline in the case of CET Film applicants). CET reserves the right to reject or waitlist any application it deems to be of questionable merit.
