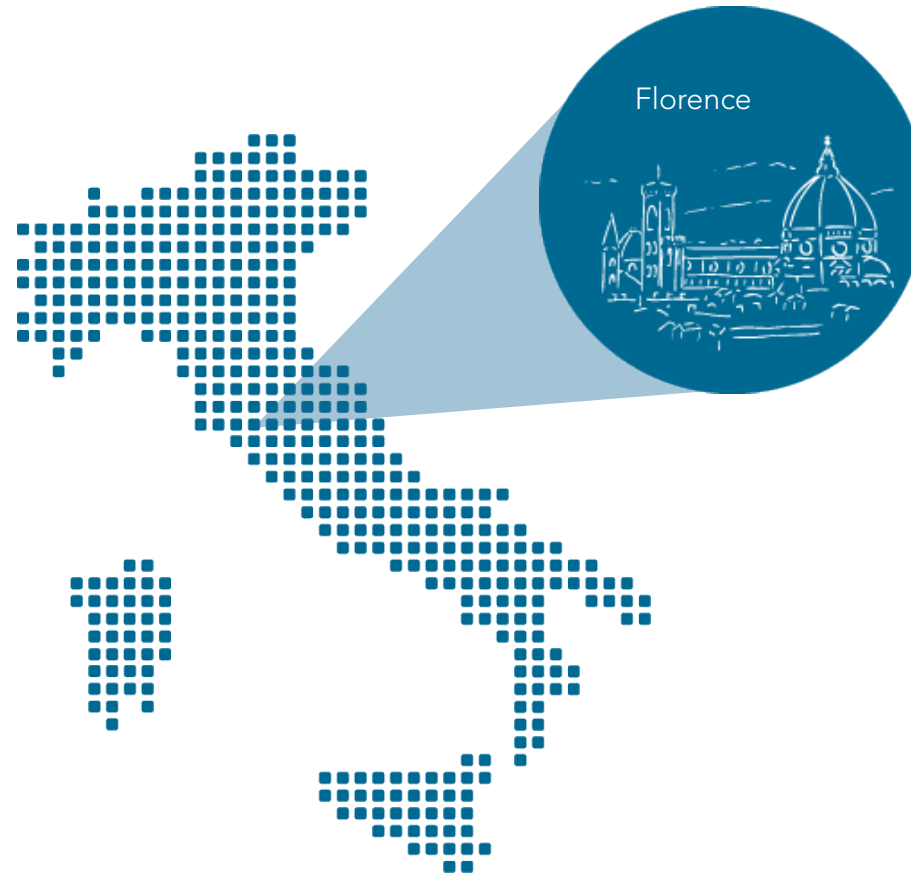

HOUSING

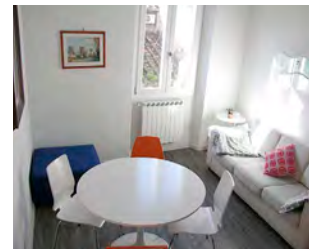
- 🏠 Apartment or homestay

LIFE IN FLORENCE

- Share an apartment in the center of Florence with other CET students. The apartments are in historic buildings, so the layouts and amenities might be different than what you are used to in the US, but they provide a truly authentic Italian experience.
- Choose to live in a homestay with a local Italian family instead. Homestays are located throughout the city, give you a chance to practice your Italian, and provide an inside look into local culture.
