



Amendment to CET Conditions and Terms for 2021

In order to allow for the most flexibility in committing to CET programs, we are adding this amendment to the CET Conditions and Terms. This amendment overrides the *Payment Schedule* section and the *Cancellation by Student Prior to Program Period* sub-section of the *Cancellation and Refund* section in the original Spring, Summer, and Fall 2021 CET Conditions and Terms. The other sections and sub-sections of the CET Conditions and Terms remain unchanged.

Payment Schedule for Programs in 2021

A program deposit of \$500 is required from students within two weeks of acceptance, unless otherwise indicated in your student account. This **deposit is refundable for Spring 2021, Summer 2021, and Fall 2021** terms only. Full payment of all fees is due by the date indicated on the invoice. All payments may be paid by credit card, check, or money order.

Students paying all or a portion of their CET program fee through their home institution must work through the policies of their home campus to process refunds and payment.

Cancellation and Refunds

Cancellation by Student Prior to Program Period for Spring 2021 Semester, Summer 2021, and Fall 2021 Semester Programs: **CET is suspending our regular Cancellation Fee Schedule.** After committing to the program, students will be able to cancel their enrollment, for any reason whatsoever, up until the day before the Program Period arrival date.

All cancellations by a student after acceptance into the program must be made in writing. The cancellation will be effective the date that the written cancellation is *received by CET staff during normal business hours*. **Students will receive a full refund of any deposit or program fee already paid once the cancellation is processed.**

Students will have the option to defer to a future term rather than cancel from a program after commitment. If they choose to do this, they will be considered a committed student for the future term and subject to CET's regular Cancellation Fee Schedule, and program fee, for the new term. If a student cancels from the deferred term they maintain financial responsibility according to the cancellation policy on the cancellation date.
